



**TUCKED IN** the heart of Manhattan's Design District is a treasure trove that will appeal to those seeking domestic enlightenment. For more than a decade, Chameleon Antique Lighting has been a destination for quality lighting options.

Chameleon proprietors John Harvey and Robert Degiarde have been in business since 1993, when they opened a tiny East Village shop selling antiques and light fixtures. Wanting to capitalize on their affinity for classic, historical lighting and the needs of their discerning clientele, in 2002 they opened a 4000-square-foot uptown showroom in which to feature their ever-growing collection of lamps, sconces, and chandeliers.

Today, Chameleon's showroom offers ornate turn-of-the-century pieces, Murano lamps from the 120s to the 150s, high-end reproductions, and more. The store's Web site guides shoppers through a pleasantly exhaustive inventory by category.
